0	<u>Damage</u> : Learner will be responsible to pay for all damage caused by their pet. In cases where more than one pet is present in shared housing and it is unclear which pet is responsible for damages, the costs will be shared by pet-owners (costs divided).
0	<u>Cleaning:</u> Learner will be responsible for cleaning up after their pet and ensuring proper disposal of waste.
0	<u>Concerns:</u> Postgraduate learners understand that, according to the <u>PARNL- collective agreement</u> , petfriendly housing for shared locations will be provided with the agreement of the sharer(s). If there are concerns raised from cohabitants regarding a pet, and if these concerns warrant the removal of a pet, a notice to vacate the property may be given to the pet-owner.

DME Expectations:

- Normally, requests for pet-friendly housing must be received by DME twelve (12) weeks in advance of the clinical experience.
- Where applicable, pet must be licensed in the municipality in which the individual resides.
- The pet must be safely contained when the learner is not on the property.
- Learners are limited to one pet; exceptions may be permitted for small caged or contained animals.
- Learners understand that in shared housing there may be more than one pet. Learners are expected to monitor the behavior and safety of cohabitating pets. DME is not responsible for damage or injury caused by a pet(s). Learners are responsible for the actions, behaviour and consequences of the pet(s). DME will not mediate any issues involving cohabitating pets.
- To ensure the safety of all pets, pets must be vaccinated and free of any communicable diseases.
- Learners are aware that DME is not responsible for providing pet-related safety equipment including a fenced yard, dog safety gates or tethers.
- Learners understand that they must adhere to the DME Housing Policy and agree to review it prior to the start of their rotation to ensure compliance.
